

FIRST AID: Medical attention is available at 2 First Aid Stations. The locations are marked on the Festival map with a cross.

LOST AND FOUND: Lost children and found articles should be taken to the Festival Information Tent.

JOHNNY APPLESEED GRAVESITE MARKER: Visit this designated National Landmark at the top of the hill near the Festival Stage.

FESTIVAL SOUVENIRS: Stop by the information tent to purchase a special item to remember the festival. You can even purchase a copy of our CD, "Music of the Johnny Appleseed Festival", featuring live recordings from previous festivals.

SCAVENGER HUNT: Come join us for some history fun. Search throughout the festival for 10 big red apples that have fun-fact questions, and clues to the answers on the other side. Get 8 or more correct and win a prize from Timmy's BBQ or Old Fort Soap Company!

ANTIQUES & PRIMITIVES: Come and enjoy our antiques, primitives and collectibles offered by our juried dealers.

SETTLERS' PIONEER VILLAGE: Join Settlers, one of the founders of the festival, as they prepare authentic pioneer recipes including beef stew, chicken corn chowder, and ham & beans. Watch as they bake cornbread in dutch ovens and serve it with fresh churned butter. Quench your thirst with sassafras tea or lemonade. Sliced apples with caramel sauce are also available. Spinning and fiber dying will be demonstrated daily. Music of the hammered dulcimer will be heard. Settlers' use the proceeds from the festival to help pay for the restoration and upkeep of the historic Swinney Homestead. Spinning and wood carving will be demonstrated daily.

DEMONSTRATORS' ENCAMPMENT: Step into the Demonstrators' Encampment and savor the heat from a blacksmith's fire. Watch as the potter transforms clay into a bowl and the basket weaver bends her hardwood boughs onto a complex frame. Visit this artists' festival within a Festival and experience the beauty and integrity of crafts as they were made in the 1800's.

FOOD VENDORS: Enjoy the tastes and smells as these vendors cook over open fires in a manner that you would have found in the 1800's. In addition to making some tasty treats, each of these food vendors has pledged 20% or more of their profits to next year's Johnny Appleseed Festival. Most will channel the rest of their profits back into our community. Now that's good eating!

CRAFT & MARKET BOOTHS: Wearing period costumes, juried craft vendors offer handiwork made exclusively from materials common to the early 1800's.

FARMERS' MARKET: Visit with area farmers, gardeners and nurserymen as they spread out the jewels of a Midwestern harvest. You can take home the makings for a fall feast.

TRADERS' MARKET: In the Trappers & Traders area, you'll find a chance to do some old-time trading with some newfangled goods. See how they lived on the trail and enjoy their stories of fur trading. NEW LOCATION - DOWN BY RIVER - SEE OUR MAP

CHILDREN'S AREA: The children's area of the festival is designed especially for schoolage children and their families. Gather along the river for this collection of pioneer games, crafts, rides and entertainment.

LIVING HISTORY ENCAMPMENT: Northeast Indiana Reenactors recreate infantry, naval, and artillery life during the 1812 era, the Revolutionary War and the Civil War. Head towards the river to hear the crack of the cannons and to see demonstrations including musket firing, period toys, and even medical procedures. Education made interesting for all ages.

COMMEMORATIVE SERVICE OF WORSHIP: Celebrate the life of John Chapman while learning about the Swedenborg faith. The Christian service will be held near the gravesite at the Festival Stage at 10:00am Sunday morning.

Anthony Blvd. Buses to the Festival grounds run continuously at no charge from PFW Campus and Concordia High School.

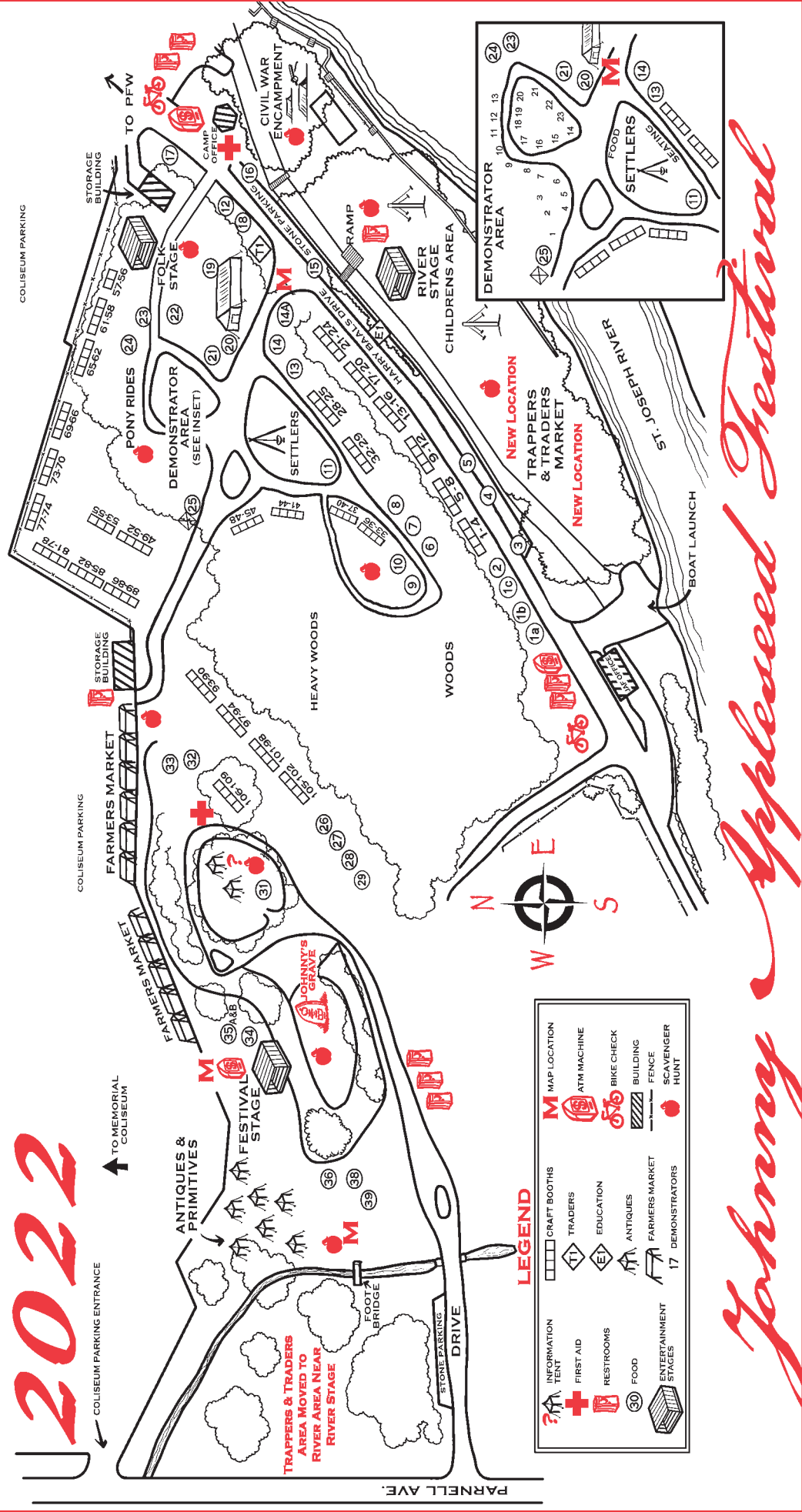
